Nearly seven decades after its end, the New Deal remains a critical reference point in American political, cultural, and economic life. Political leaders define their policy programs in the context of the New Deal, the nation's economy operates in a regulatory framework partially laid out by the New Deal, and Americans structure their lives around social policies and cultural assumptions created by or during the New Deal.
