COURSE DESCRIPTION

This nine-week course focuses on the study of concepts that make connections between art and life through the disciplines of aesthetics, art criticism, art history, and art production. Studio skill development is emphasized in drawing, sculpture, and crafts. Students examine the importance of art in their own and other societies and identify some of the influences that art forms from the past have upon art forms of the present.

- 6.14 Students will express personal ideas through art production.
- 6.15 Students will use critical questioning for art production.

- 6.17 Students will use personal and social symbols in art production.
- 6.18.1 Students will begin to build a knowledge base for art production.

- 6.19 Students will use problem-solving strategies to communicate and express ideas.
