- 7.10 Students will explore and experiment with various media and techniques when expressing ideas.
- 7.11 Students will use technology for researching and expressing ideas.
- 7.12 Students will create artwork based on prior experiences and new knowledge.
- 7.13 Students will incorporate knowledge from subject areas other than art to produce artwork.
- 7.14 Students will use problem-solving strategies to express ideas and themes in art production.
- 7.15 Students will use artworks as a primary source of historical and cultural understanding.
