COURSE DESCRIPTION

This semester course focuses on the study of concepts that make connections between art and life through the disciplines of aesthetics, art criticism, art history, and art production. Studio skill development is emphasized in drawing, painting, sculpture, and crafts. Students examine Western and non-Western art to determine the influence various cultures have had upon each other. The impact of technology on historic and current art forms is also examined. Students will explore career options in the field of art.

AESTHETICS

- 8.1 Students will examine the basic theories of art such as Formalism, Expressionism, Contextualism, and Imitationalism to develop a personal philosophy of art.
- 8.2 Students will develop specific criteria for judging the quality of artwork.

ART CRITICISM

How Do We Respond to Works of Art?

- 8.3 Students will establish specific criteria for evaluating interpretations of artwork.
- 8.4 Students will analyze why artworks produce multiple interpretations.
- 8.5 Students will examine the importance of context for interpreting artwork.
- 8.6 Students will compare the use of symbols among various artworks.
- 8.7 Students will understand the embedded meanings in art media.

ART PRODUCTION

How and Why Do We Make Art?

- 8.8 Students will create multiple artworks to explore an idea.
- 8.9 Students will explore an idea in depth through art production.
- 8.10 Students will make conscious choices of media and techniques for expressive purposes.
- 8.11 Students will produce artwork based upon contemporary issues.
- 8.12 Students will create a personal artwork that is influenced by knowledge gained from cultural studies.
- 8.13 Students will create a personal artwork that is influenced by knowledge gained from the study of art.
- 8.14 Students will use technology to build a knowledge base for art production.
- 8.15 Students will use problem-solving strategies to communicate an idea.

- 8.16 Students will discuss the factors that influenced specific artworks.
- 8.17 Students compare and contrast artworks through the ages.
- 8.18 Students will use artworks as a primary source of historical and cultural understanding.
