## **GUIDE TO HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER PROGRAMS 2021**

### *Mission Statement*

***Virginia Beach City Public Schools, in partnership with the entire community, will empower every student to become a life-long learner who is a responsible, productive and engaged citizen within the global community.***

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

This guide provides students and families with specific information about the programs that are available in summer school. Students and families should review this publication and consult with school counselors and/or teachers to determine which programs may be appropriate. When selecting a program, it is important to remember that all courses offered in Virginia Beach City Public Schools are available on a non-discriminatory basis. COVID protocols as determined by the CDC will be followed.

### **HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS**

The high school summer programs provide credit courses for high school students to accelerate their program of study or to repeat courses not successfully completed during the regular school year. Students enrolling in a credit bearing course for the first time must complete a two-session summer program equal to one year of instruction in the regular school term to receive full credit. The Virginia Beach Digital Campus ONLINE courses are taught in the two-session summer format. All course offerings are dependent upon sufficient enrollment and the availability of certified and endorsed instructors.

Students who failed a course during the 2020-2021 school year and need to retake the course will have the synchronous option of Face-to-Face instruction or Virtual instruction through Schoology at one of

the two high school sites. Students repeating a course need to complete a one-session summer course. Parents and students should work with school counselors and teachers to determine the best fit for the student.

If your student needs to retake an SOL course to meet the Standards of Learning (SOL) verified credit diploma criteria, SOL Fast Track Tutoring will be available during the 2021 Summer Sessions. SOL Fast Track tutoring classes are optional and may be adjusted based on enrollment. New this summer school will be Boost Opportunities for science and math courses. These preparation courses are designed to build the skills necessary for success in the courses students plan to take during the 2021-2022 school year. These courses will be asynchronous with synchronous teacher office hours for support and are available at no cost to the parents and/or guardians.

All VBCPS students who are taking a summer school course which requires an end-of-course (EOC) SOL test must take the SOL test scheduled during summer school, unless the student has already passed the test. Students must be enrolled in Virginia Beach City Public Schools for the 2021-2022 school year before testing begins. All SOL tests except writing require one day of testing. Students who are scheduled to complete graduation requirements by August 19, 2021 and are taking the SOL EOC writing test require four days of testing. Students scheduled to complete graduation standards after August 19, 2021 and are taking the SOL EOC Writing test require two days of testing.

Students and families should note that all programs are dependent on enrollment and the availability of qualified and endorsed instructional staff. Enrollment in some courses may be limited due space at a particular school. If a course is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment, students may be allowed to enroll in the course at another site. Transportation outside the cluster will not be provided.

Unless otherwise noted, all courses are restricted to students in grades 9 through 12. Rising ninth grade students may also attend high school summer school programs.

## **ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT**

Attendance during summer school will be monitored in accordance with School Board Policy 5-17. Teachers will maintain an accurate record of attendance/absences by class session.

Students are expected to attend each class session each day. A student will not be granted credit or considered for promotion to the next grade level if absent more than four (4) class sessions within a given session. Each day in summer school consists of two (2) class sessions.

A parent/guardian may request a waiver of the summer school attendance policy by submitting the standard waiver request form to the summer school principal at the end of each summer school session. Appeals should be forwarded to the Office of Student Leadership.

*The Code of Student Conduct* will remain in effect during Summer School 2021. *The Code of Student Conduct* outlines the expectation for student behavior. Students will be subject to suspension or dismissal from classes by the summer school principal if they violate policies regarding student conduct or if their behavior is disruptive and/or interferes with classroom instruction. If a student is dismissed due to behavior, he or she is not eligible for a refund of summer school tuition.

## HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL 2021 SITES/TRANSPORTATION CLUSTERS

### TRANSPORTATION

Schools have been grouped together to form transportation clusters. Bus transportation will be available for many programs from neighborhood pickup points within the cluster to designated summer school sites. If transportation is provided for a specific program, it will be listed with the information in this guide describing the program. **Transportation is provided only within the transportation clusters.**

Students who have been removed from their home or enrolled schools as a result of disciplinary infractions are not allowed to attend summer school at that cluster site. However, the students are allowed to attend summer school at another cluster site. Parents/guardians are responsible for providing transportation to alternate sites.

Renaissance Academy will serve as the support site for all online classes. Students enrolled in online SOL courses are expected to take the associated SOL test in person at the Renaissance Academy on the scheduled testing date.

Parents/guardians and students are responsible for providing transportation to alternate sites.

High school ESL students will be attending the summer school program at the appropriate middle school site (Brandon Middle School or Corporate Landing Middle School).

The first school listed in each line (in bold print) is the summer school site. Students will attend Monday through Thursday.

## REGISTRATION

Virginia Beach City Public Schools offers summer school courses in three formats: face-to-face or virtual at the summer site and completely online. Students may register to take classes in one or multiple formats. Registrations are submitted electronically.

**Note:** no course registration or payments for online courses will be accepted at any summer school before or during regular summer school registration.

### **Face-to-Face/Virtual Course Registration**

Information regarding face-to-face or virtual course electronic registration will be available on the VBCPS website. Electronic registration and payment online begins on **June 1, 2021** at 12:00 p.m. for face-to-face/virtual courses at [http://www.vbschools.com/academic\\_programs/summer\\_school](http://www.vbschools.com/academic_programs/summer_school); registration closes on **June 23, 2021** at 8:00 a.m. Students must provide their student identification number at the time of registration.

Registration and payment of fees for summer school course must be completed online. Both registration and payment must be completed before leaving the registration website. **Students are not officially registered until payment is received.**

TRAEP students will be required to provide a letter from the principal at TRAEP, recommending summer school attendance. Registration location administrators may also contact the Office of Student Leadership to request verification. The students will not be permitted enrollment without the written recommendation of the principal at TRAEP and/or the verification from the Office of Student Leadership.

### **Virginia Beach Digital Campus Courses**

Information about the asynchronous online program will be available through the Virginia Beach Digital Campus website ([http://www.vbschools.com/academic\\_programs/distance\\_learning/virginia\\_beach\\_digital\\_campus](http://www.vbschools.com/academic_programs/distance_learning/virginia_beach_digital_campus)) on **April 21, 2021**. Students may begin to register and pay online for online summer school courses using the link provided on the website on **May 18, 2021** at 12:00 p.m. Registration will close **June 23, 2021** at 8:00 a.m. Students enrolled in online versions of courses that require an End-of-Course SOL test are expected to take that test in person at the Renaissance Academy on the scheduled testing date.

Registration and payment of fees for online summer school courses must be completed online. Both registration and payment must be completed before leaving the registration website. **Students are not enrolled until payment is received.**

## **Non-VBCPS Students with Virginia Beach Residency**

Only students whose parents/guardians are residents of Virginia Beach are eligible to attend VBCPS summer school classes. It is the responsibility of the student/parent/guardian to obtain written permission from the administration of the student's current school to attend summer classes and to have credits earned transferred.

### **Eligible non-VBCPS enrollees must present documentation of residency.**

Before an out-of-district student may begin a summer school class, the following documentation will need to be provided to establish residency:

- Certified birth certificate for any student being admitted for the first time to any public school;
- Two proofs of address (examples include: signed lease/mortgage statement, current gas, water, electric bill);
- Proof of legal custody of student if living only temporarily in the household, and;
- Current immunization record

Once the appointment is made, please bring the above-mentioned documents to the Office of Student Support Services at Plaza Annex, 641 Carriage Hill Road, Virginia Beach, Virginia, 23452. Questions regarding the registration process should be directed to the summer school office at (757)263-6856.

## **TRANSFER OF CREDIT**

Summer school courses not taken in Virginia Beach City Public Schools must meet the requirements of courses taken in Virginia Beach City Public Schools. It is the responsibility of the student and/or parent/guardian to obtain prior written permission from the principal of the student's current school to determine credits earned in summer school outside Virginia Beach City Public Schools.

## **TUITION**

Tuition must be paid at the time of registration. Payment must be made immediately online with a credit or debit card. If the parent/guardian is unable to pay online, please call the Office of Student Support Services at (757) 263-6856 to schedule an appointment at Plaza Annex. The English as a Second Language Program (ESL), Extended School Year (ESY) services, SOL Fast Track Tutoring and Prep Courses are provided at no cost.

## REDUCED TUITION FOR ELIGIBLE STUDENTS

Students who have a completed free/reduced meal form on file and have been determined eligible for reduced price or free meals during the 2020-2021 school year are eligible to receive summer school tuition at no cost.

*The rates below are discounted for this summer only (Summer 2021) based upon the impact of COVID-19. The rates are subject to change for the upcoming years' summer school sessions.*
