The Department of Teaching and Learning seeks to continue the services of Enseñar Educational Services, Inc. in the 2020-2021 school year to provide continued expertise and support with the transition of using the response to intervention (RTI) method to identify students with learning disabilities instead of relying solely on the discrepancy model.

The expertise and support from Enseñar Educational Services, Inc., particularly from Robert H. Pasternack, Ph.D., will be used to assist in training psychologists on evaluation practices; developing a policies and procedures manual related to evaluation and reevaluation, including use of the RTI process; developing and providing professional learning opportunities to staff groups on using the response to intervention (RTI) method to identify students with learning disabilities; and working with Special Education Advisory Committee to execute the special education plan.

Enseñar Educational Services, Inc. is the only company in the United States serving Local Education Agencies (LEAs) and State Education Agencies (SEAs) led exclusively by Dr. Robert Pasternak. Dr. Pasternack's expertise in the area of critical need (special education) for our school division comes as a result of his having served as Assistant Secretary for the Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services (OSERS) at the U.S. Department of Education. Serving in that capacity, he was directly responsible for the reauthorization of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and the implementation of No Child Left Behind which provides the foundation for special education law. He also served previously as a State Director of Special Educational diagnostician, a certified school administrator, and a certified teacher (K-12).

Enseñar Educational Services' uniquely qualified team works with the learning community, education leaders, and families of students with disabilities to improve outcomes while also working to reduce inappropriate referrals to special education through the implementation of an intervention framework.
