

2023-2024 Pupil/Teacher Ratios for Middle and High Schools Excluding and Including Resource Personnel

The Virginia Standards of Quality requires each school board to report to the public annually the actual pupil/teacher ratios in middle and high schools by school for the current school year, no later than December 31. The Virginia Standards of Quality requires that two pupil/teacher ratios be calculated. The first ratio includes only the teachers who teach the grade and class on a full-time basis and excludes resource personnel. The second ratio includes resource personnel (e.g., instructional technology specialists, library media specialists, and gifted resource teachers). In order to calculate the ratios, the Office of Research and Evaluation used the student membership as of December 1 to determine the number of students at each school and the Office of Budget Development provided the number of instructional staff positions at each school. To determine the pupil/teacher ratios for each school, the student membership was divided by the total number of instructional positions for each required ratio (without or with resource). It is important to note that these pupil/teacher ratios may not reflect the situation in a given classroom, and pupil/teacher ratios in individual classrooms will vary. Instead, the pupil/teacher ratios represent an overall picture across all classrooms in a school including general education classrooms, special education classrooms, elective classes, AP classes, technical and career education classes, etc.
